Week 3 - Pastor Rob Ketterling

Let's Recap:

In this series we're looking at the heavens and the stars to see God in His splendor. We're taking time to be inspired by God's creation of the stars, learn about how He used stars in His Word, and stand in awe of His greatness. This week Pastor Rob spoke about why we shouldn't look TO the stars for guidance and direction, but instead to look to God and His Word.

Tune In:

In preparation for this week's discussion, read Deuteronomy 4:19, Deuteronomy 18:9-14, and Isaiah 8:19-20 together.

Go Deep:

1. Have you taken any time during this series to look at the stars on a clear summer night. If you did, how did God speak to you in that moment? How should we look to the stars for inspiration without it turning unhealthy?
2. Our world loves to know what's happening next. That's probably why horoscopes and tarot cards are so popular. Why do you think we have a fascination with knowing the future or what's next? Why does God caution us against such practices?
3. Philippians 2:15 says, "So that you may become blameless and pure, Children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation. Then you will shine among them like the stars in the sky." How can we shine like stars in a world full of darkness? Think of some ways you can shine like a star this week at your workplace, home, or neighborhood.

Live Out:

Let's not look TO the stars for guidance and direction, but instead we should look AT the stars to be inspired by God, the Creator. He doesn't want us to look for guidance and direction from ungodly things. He's given us His Word, the Bible, the lamp to our feet and light to our path. Let's look to Jesus, and be a shining light to world as we reflect His grace and love to those around us.
