

## **His Name Will Be – The Three Redeemers**

### **Key Points:**

- Like Ruth, there are times when we shouldn't take no for an answer! In these redeeming moments, we need to stir up fierce courage to defend the people, calling, and spiritual responsibility God has entrusted to us.
- Like Boaz, there are times when we need to say yes to an unexpected, unconventional redeeming moment on behalf of someone, even if it costs us.
- Any time you are working with a Redeemer, outsiders become insiders.
- If God can redeem you from the grip of sin and death, how much more can He redeem your name, your time, your mind, your possessions, your body, your legacy?

### **Main Scripture Reference(s):**

### **Discussion Questions:**

1. As you look at the various challenges or opportunities facing you, what redeeming moments do you sense the Lord calling you to step into with a strong spirit?
2. Who in your sphere of influence is an "outsider" with unmet needs? Perhaps you know someone who needs to be welcomed into healthy community, or who needs tangible provision. Pray for them, and listen to what the Holy Spirit may be asking you to do to be a redeemer in their circumstances.
3. In what areas do you feel like you have lost sight of your name and divinely-created identity? Ask the Holy Spirit to renew your mind and bring you to a higher perspective to trust Him in the midst of circumstances that have brought you low.
4. In what ways do you feel like you have lost too much time? What divinely-planted ideas, relationships, passions, dreams seem to be dead and gone?

Share these visions with someone from your family, friends, or small group. Together, ask the Holy Spirit to breathe life back into these areas. Encourage one another to fight for the mission and territory God has given you, but the enemy has tried to steal away.
